#### **Today's Collect**

Eternal God, our maker and redeemer, grant us, with all the faithful departed, the sure benefits of your Son's saving passion and glorious resurrection that, in the last day, when you gather up all things in Christ, we may with them enjoy the fullness of your promises; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

First Reading Lamentations 3: 17-26, 31-33

- 17 My soul is bereft of peace;
- I have forgotten what happiness is; 18 so I say, 'Gone is my glory,
- 18 so I say, 'Gone is my glory, and all that I had hoped for from the Lord.'
- 19 The thought of my affliction and my homelessness is wormwood and gall!
- <sup>20</sup> My soul continually thinks of it and is bowed down within me.
- <sup>21</sup> But this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope:
- <sup>22</sup> The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end;
- <sup>23</sup> they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.
- <sup>24</sup> 'The Lord is my portion,' says my soul, 'therefore I will hope in him.'

Second Reading I Peter 1: 3-9

<sup>3</sup> Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, <sup>4</sup> and into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, <sup>5</sup> who are being protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. <sup>6</sup> In this you rejoice, even if now for a little while you have had to suffer various trials, <sup>7</sup> so that the genuineness of your faith—being more precious than gold that, though perishable, is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honour when Jesus Christ is revealed. <sup>8</sup> Although you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, <sup>9</sup> for you are receiving the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

#### **Today's Collect**

Almighty Father, whose will is to restore all things in your beloved Son, the King of all: govern the hearts and minds of those in authority, and bring the families of the nations, divided and torn apart by the ravages of sin, to be subject to his just and gentle rule; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

First Reading Jonah 3.1-5, 10

3The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, <sup>2</sup>'Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.' <sup>3</sup>So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. <sup>4</sup>Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, 'Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!' <sup>5</sup>And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.

10 When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

Second Reading Hebrews 9.24-end

<sup>24</sup>For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. <sup>25</sup>Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; <sup>26</sup>for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. <sup>27</sup>And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement, <sup>28</sup>so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

I6 As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake—for they were fishermen. <sup>17</sup> And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fish for people.' <sup>18</sup> And immediately they left their nets and followed him. <sup>19</sup> As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. <sup>20</sup> Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

### ZOE WILSON AND AN APPEAL FOR A VACCINE TO HELP HER FIGHT CANCER #teamzoe

Without any warning, Zoe Wilson's life was upended one day this spring. A massive seizure in the shower led to an abrupt, devastating diagnosis of an aggressive, malignant brain tumour. Doctors told her that without treatment she might only live for three more months, and with surgery, chemotherapy and radiotherapy, average life expectancy was 15 months.

Zoe, 35, who is an English teacher and a mother to two young boys, has now endured two lengthy operations to remove the bulk of the tumour. She's also had radiotherapy, and is currently undergoing cycles of chemo in an effort to

eradicate as much of the remaining tumour. But this type of cancer is very hard to treat, and the tumour cells will ultimately mutate to evade the chemo.

The most promising treatment for Zoe's cancer is immunotherapy: it is regularly used in Germany because it has been shown to extend sufferers' lives. But it's not available on the NHS - which is why we are crowdfunding now. All Zoe wants is to spend as much time as possible with her young family. Any help - by either contributing to the fund, or sharing our page - would be so gratefully appreciated. Thank you for your help.

#### **UPDATE FROM MATTHEW ON THE FUNDRAISING-**

As those who know me will testify, it's not often I am speechless, but today, speechless I am. When Zoe and I launched the crowd funder, we of course hoped that people would donate, but to have raised over 40% in 6 days is beyond our wildest dreams and our most hopeful expectations. Thank you!

I've asked the English teacher if there is a word that means a most sincere, appreciative, deep thanks - nothing has yet been forthcoming - but that is the sort of thank you we are sending you all.

We have now covered the cost of the initial manufacturing in Germany and a vaccine should be ready in around 10 to 12 weeks!

There are still many expenses on the horizon, all being well, Zoe will have 14 injections. Each injection in Germany has clinic costs associated with it including administering it, blood tests to monitor Zoe's immune response and drugs to boost it! There will also be the costs of travel to and from Germany, initially for 10 to 12 days for the first 4 injections, then every 4 to 6 weeks for the remaining 10 boosters.

We feel so supported by our amazing family, friends and even people we have never met! Thank you deeply from the bottom of our hearts. **Matthew** 

#### ANOTHER UPDATE FROM MATTHEW

I thought that is was high time for an update from us, especially as we are rapidly approaching 85% of our ambitious target! Thank you for all the donations, likes and shares! We are incredibly humbled by your kindness!

Zoe finished taking her pills for her 2nd round of Chemotherapy, this time they made her feel quite sick, but loaded with a small pharmacies worth of anti-emetics she was able to come out the other side. To celebrate, on the way home from Oncology we called into the Kings Arms, Prestbury for a celebratory lunch! Zoe now has to wait another 4 weeks for her bloods/bone marrow to recover, before she can start the next cycle.

Another major milestone was that Zoe felt well enough to go back to work, after 6 months away, albeit only for a morning and she was completely wiped out for the rest of day and had to sleep it off! Her employer are being very supportive and enabling her to gradually scale up her hours as she re-adjusts, especially as she is still having treatment.

Life has been as busy (or busier than ever)! Bits of concrete were falling down from our roof like meteors from space, so worried we might decapitate one of the neighbours, it was high time to get it fixed! I am pleased to report completion of the works! Our one and only shower has also been broken for over 3 weeks, while Wickes try and find a replacement part.

Production of the vaccine continues, and all being well we hope to be in Germany before Christmas for the first injections.

Wow, we are so close to our target now, having just shot over 90%!! Thank you all for your incredible support. We have nearly done it!!

The start of half term saw us all head to Legoland where we had a wonderful time! I'm not quite sure who enjoyed it most, John or Zoe, but one thing is for sure it was a most memorable trip for our family.

The remainder of half term was a bit muted, Mark got a positive covid test and had to be isolated. He seems perfectly well, which is something to be thankful for.



We saw Zoe's oncologist in Cheltenham today and he seemed pleased with her progress. She will therefore start her next round of chemo pills tomorrow when she gets back from work.

We also heard from the German clinic last week. Production of the vaccine is going well and Zoe is booked in for her first injection on the 10th December! An early Christmas present for us all. It is very exciting that we will be on our way to Germany in about six weeks, and it is all thanks to the incredible generosity of you, our supporters!


#### ST LAWRENCE'S CHILDREN'S SOCIETY BOXES.
